She was preceded in death by her brother, Joseph Barnett III and brother-in-law, Oscar (Johnny) Vallot.

The family moved to Detroit, Michigan in 1941 where Esther attended Detroit Public Schools and graduated from Northwestern High School in 1951. She accepted Christ as a child and converted to Catholicism before marriage. After a year of dating, she married her first love, Prosper (Pete) A. Livingston in 1954. To this union they had two children, Dr. Ronald A. Livingston and Andrea D. Livingston.

She graduated from Wayne State University College of Nursing. She found fulfillment in her career as a Registered Nurse in the Emergency room at Henry Ford Hospital where she was employed for several years.
