Wannetta Louise Brown was born on August 28, 1947, in the City of Anawalt, West Virginia to the union of Hubert Brown and Wanda Lee Marshall-Brown. Wannetta accepted Christ an at early age, attending Mount Bethel Church and becoming a longtime member of the church's choir. The daughter of a proud coal miner, Wannetta also learned the value of hard work, working as a housekeeper along with siblings for residents outside of town. In her teens, she worked as a candy striper at a local hospital, and in her alma mater's school cafeteria, Gary District High School.

Wannetta graduated from Gary District High in 1965, and later came to Detroit, Michigan. She attended Highland Park Community College, and the Detroit Business Institute. She was employed at Michigan Bell (AT&T) for 30 years working her way up from switchboard operator, payroll clerk, administrator, to a manager in the conference, corporate security, human resources, and training bureaus. She also became active in the Communication Workers of America (CWA). Officially retiring in 1995, Wannetta would return to work as a contractor for Michigan Bell (then SBC) in 2001. In addition to her stellar career at Michigan Bell, Wannetta would go on to serve the citizens of the State of Michigan as the Executive Assistant to the Director of Southeast Michigan and Governor Jennifer Granholm in 2003. She proudly served Directors Robert Davis and Kim Trent until the offices transitioned into another administration in 2011.

Committed to public service, Wannetta continued to serve in Michigan's Unemployment Insurance Agency until her retirement in 2016.

Aside from her careers, Wannetta enjoyed spending time with her family, especially her two boys, Herbert and Hubert. Known for her fashion sense and fine jewelry, Wannetta enjoyed shopping, vintage coin collecting and estate sailing. She also enjoyed volunteering with various church community groups with her friends and family. A southern lady, she believed in cooking during the holidays, and was well known for her whole fryer fried chicken recipe.
