Betty's passion was cooking and everyone that knew her loved her food. She especially liked baking and preparing a feast every holiday, birthday, special event or just because she could. She loved being around people and surrounded herself with family and friends. Everybody would meet up at Bet's house on a regular basis and everyone was welcome.

She appreciated a good joke, laughter and good times. She had one of the most gentle spirits and could never say no. She made everybody feel special.
