My Story:

Charleston Hazel Tate, age 94, passed away on Monday, June 6, 2016. She was the second child born to the late Hazel Hornbuckle and the late Eliza Peason Hornbuckle in Dallas, Texas, on September 15, 1921. Her siblings: older sister, Willie Mae Foster and younger sister, Ella Ruth Little as well as her younger brother, Enoch "EH" Hornbuckle preceded her in death.

Charleston Tate accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized at Greater Bethlehem Church in Dallas, Texas by the late Pastor CC. Choice. She graduated from Julia C. Frazier Preparatory School in Dallas and later attended nursing school. She married Samuel Florence (deceased) and had two children, Ruby Stein Hunley (deceased) and Donald Ray Florence.

She loved to make people laugh and welcomed children. She was affectionately called Mom or Grandma by most in her neighborhood who stopped by to talk and pet her longtime dog, Cookie (deceased). When others asked for advice, she would say "Pray about it. Leave it in God's Hands."
