Emma Louise Abrams was born on September 26, 1936 in Renizi, Mississippi to the late Walter and Charline Clark. She was the eldest of two children. Her sister, Catherine preceded her in death.

Louise received her education in the Detroit Public School System and graduated from Commerce High School. She was employed with National Bank of Detroit (NBD) for 32 plus years as a bank teller and was later promoted into management until retirement.

In 1955, Louise met and married the love of her life, Roger Lamar Abrams and they remained united for 63 years. To this union two children were born, Denise and Anthony. Her son "Tony" and husband "Rog" preceded her in death. Louise joined Central CME Church in August, 1963 along with her husband under the pastorate of Rev. Homer Draper. She sang in The Voices of Central and was a noted soloist. Louise was a charter member of the Homer Draper Club organized by Rev. Paul O. Thomas on January 27, 1985. She had the distinction of being elected as the first female to serve on the Steward Board and was designated as the Steward for the Stewardess Board. Louise served her church faithfully and was known as "Sunshine" because of her charming personality, graciousness and generosity.

She loved her family and friends and that love was reciprocated. On December 25, 2019 God called her home to her final resting place where she joined her husband, son, parents, sister and other relatives who preceded her

in death.
