Ephraim Roberts was born in Gainesville, Alabama on May 7, 1943. He was the second of ten children born to John W. Roberts, Sr. and Georgia Mae Roberts. He was preceded in death by his parents, three sisters, Ellen Terry, Brenda and Augusta; and one brother, Franklin.

Ephraim grew up in Bessemer, Alabama and was educated in the Alabama school system. He confessed faith in Christ at an early age and joined Jerusalem Baptist Church, under the leadership of Reverend Wilson Fallin, Sr., where he attended with his father and older brother, John, Jr. He remained faithful until he moved to Detroit, Michigan in 1966.

In Detroit, Ephraim started working for Ford Motor Company, he served faithfully until he retired in 1998.
