Reflecting On The Life Of Ernestine Louise Stewart:

Ernestine Louise Stewart was born on December 8, 1938, to the late Embra and Mary Elizabeth Chambers in Memphis, Tennessee. She was the youngest child of fifteen born to this union, and 12 siblings preceded her in death.

Because her mother and father were rooted in the church, she accepted Christ at an early age at New Testament Church of God In Christ, which was formerly known as Wilkins Street Church of God in Christ. She later joined Power Hope and Grace Bible Church and was baptized in 2004 under the leadership of Bishop Quintin Wingate.

In 1953, Ernestine married the late Willie Williams. Two children were born to this union: Michaela and Peri. In 1967, she was joined in matrimony to James Stewart and one child was born to this union, Jon.'

Ernestine enjoyed working at a number of jobs during her life but made her biggest marks at Ford Motor Company in the late 1970s through the early 1980s and as a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) in the 1990s through the early 2000s. She excelled in her role as a CNA and was elected as a union steward. She traveled to Lansing numerous times in support of her colleagues in the Service Employees International Union.

Ernestine was a fun-loving and high-spirited woman who in her early years

loved to bowl and play a friendly hand of cards with family and friends. Later in life, her biggest passion was being with her family and going to church on Sunday to hear the Word. She was known to say “Oh, I’m going to church.” She loved her children and adored her grandchildren. “Stine,” as she was affectionately known to her family and friends, was also an avid cook who loved serving her family and looked forward to the annual Thanksgiving gathering at her home.

Ernestine was a proud, classy lady with a passion for dressing sharp, and she was known to light up a room with her big, beautiful smile. She was a favorite among many family members and was regularly sought out for her wisdom or just a listening ear.
