Eula Regina Moredock known affectionately as “Sissy” or “Jean”, was born on March 19, 1934 to Edward and Clara Mae Chapman-Moredock. Originally from, Owensboro, Kentucky, Jean graduated from Western High School in 1951 and graduated once again from Barlow Cosmetology School in Indiana. Jean started her cosmetology business after she moved to Detroit in 1960. In 1961, she moved her business to Ivy’s Beauty Salon on Tireman, to where she was a beautician for over 50 years.

She gave herself to God at the age of 12. Jean has been a member of Tabernacle Baptist Church since 1962. She spent her time a part of many ministries and Dawn Seekers Sunday class. Jean has been an usher for 50 years, to which she received her 50th usher pin in 2016. Volunteering was one of her greatest passions. Jean loved to help out in Tabernacle’s kitchen, was a big supporter for the March of Dimes, was a lifetime member of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), and was a part of many other clubs and associations. In 1977, she became an honorary member of Girl Scouts of America after selling Girl Scout Cookies and Schermer’s Pecans to her clients, church members, family, friends, and community, and adopted the nickname “Cookie & Peanut Lady”. Because of her efforts, she was awarded numerous Girl Scout pins for selling the highest number of Girl Scout Cookies. Whether it was selling T-shirts, sweatshirts, or

tickets to church events, Jean enjoyed fund-raising for her church.

Although Jean never gave birth to any children, she had lots of young people to whom she regarded as her nieces and nephews. Their obtaining their education, was most important to her. She was constantly preaching education to every “next generation”, regardless of how old one was. She believed that education was the key to a successful life.

October 16, 2017, Jean made her transition at Beaumont Hospital.

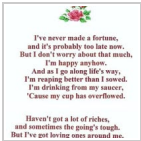
