Everlee M. Doughton, affectionately known as Peg or Peggy was born on a warm sunny Saturday. The date was June 11, 1927, in Tyler Town, Mississippi to the late Reverend Booker T. and Arcenia B. Magee. She was the eldest daughter, and her sisters knew who was in charge.

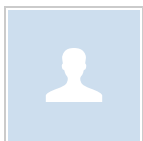
