“*Rev. Evin Lowery Fobbs spent a lifetime of service standing up and defending rights, and liberties of community residents of his native city of Detroit, and of those residents of the State of Michigan. He continued through his teenage years and adult life a commitment to justice for those that were often ignored or were left abandoned and helpless until he died suddenly of a massive heart attack. For sixty-one years Evin was a leader. He spent his young teen years as leader of Keep Detroit Beautiful Team for the City of Detroit. Evin in his adult life was a person who worked as a police officer at the 10th Pct. He became a Traffic Investigator for the City of Detroit approx. 15 years. He was a dedicated Michigan Parole Board Member, a gubernatorial and presidential appointee tackling tough work and protecting those who were often defenseless. He return to the city of Detroit, where he work as an appointee for the Wayne County Deputy Sheriff Department. Afterward he joined Wayne County JDS. Evin was dedicated to his job becoming a mentor to the trouble youths at the Juvenile Detention Facility. Evin last position was a Investigator for the Wayne County Medical Examiner for many years Evin Lowery Fobbs was also a person who made history is tackling a seemingly unwinnable issues when he and fellow police officers won a historic U.S. Supreme Court case against the city of Detroit . As Heroes are often called upon by the times and are strengthened by the steady hand of God. This was a belief that Evin learned from his parents, as a Southwestern High School JRROTC Lt. Colonel and Cadet Commander or as an editor of several community neighborhood newsletters and a VISTA Volunteer. Service and commitment to the least of those was his creed. In the last year Evin dedicated himself to working on issues that would enhance the traditional, religious and constitutional values that America’s founding fathers built the nation upon. His legacy and is work is still cherished. Evin will be able to be given the dignity and final rest with a loving God he deserves.
