Mrs. Flora Mae (Knight) Hazzard, a loving mother, grandmother, sister, aunt, niece, and loyal friend entered this world on May 26, 1939 in the city of Natchez, Mississippi, the city with the beautiful magnolias and stately pine trees.

Relatives and friends who knew Flora well referred to her as Flo. Flora's parents, mother Lula and stepfather Ben Dixon, relocated to Detroit when Flora was very young.

In Detroit, lifelong trainings were to begin. She graduated from Commerce High School in 1957 with further education at the University of Detroit and Wayne County Community College. Throughout her lifetime, she took many enrichment classes in cooking, floral design, and bridge.

In Detroit she met her husband Charlie Hazzard and they were married on May 26, 1963 and blessed with two sons Kyle and Marc and a devoted nephew, Kenneth Ross who was like one of their own. They remained happily married until Charlie departed this life in 1999.

Flo worked for the State of Michigan for more than 30 years spending most of those years with the Family Independent Agency (formally known as the Department of Social Services) servicing in various supervisory positions before retiring in 1997.

After retirement, she traveled around the world to places such as China, Italy, and Amsterdam to name a few. True to her name, Flora, (in Roman

mythology, the goddess of flowers and spring) Flo was a lover of flowers, as evident with making floral arrangements and a beautiful garden she kept. Flo enjoyed working, socializing, organizing, and just being with people. She had memberships in various social and card clubs as well as the Commerce High School Alumni Association. On many occasions, Flo was a “committee of one), organizing a family reunion or a Sorrento block yard sale.
