“ Freddy lee was a wonderful person whom I became friends with in high school, though we went to different schools. I was at Owensboro Catholic and Fred at Western. This was back in the early '50's before Owensboro schools were integrated. We hung out at Shown's drugstore a lot where Fred worked, part time. It had a soda fountain where many of us gathered after school and that's where I met Fred. We also worked together at one of the loose leaf tobacco warehouses where the farmers would unload their tobacco and Fred and I would stack it on "duckbills" and drag it with long steel hooks to the auction site. They were heavy and I was much smaller than Fred. He showed me that it wasn't just brute strength but rather "technique" in getting it moved. I wouldn't have made it there without Fred. He was a gifted athlete who made friends easily and had many friends. When I moved back to Owensboro a few years ago from California, I looked for Fred and was told he had moved to Michigan. He was a great guy and we will all miss him. May he rest in peace at the right hand of God.
