*I remember when my mom and my sisters and I lived on Euclid Street. Your mom and dad lived on Montgomery Street. Your mom would babysit us sometimes. When Uncle Fred got home from work we would all sit down to eat dinner together and Uncle Fred was always happy to spend time with us. He got a kick out of calling us "The 3 Little Bears."*

*Decades later, 2 years before I moved to Hawaii, Uncle Fred and I worked at the Detroit Water & Sewerage Department (DWSD) Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). Uncle Fred was a Primary Treatment Incinerator Operator. I was a Junior Civil Engineer.*

*Uncle Fred operated an incinerator all by himself and had the incinerator building all to himself every day. He had a small refrigerator filled with carbonated drinks and food and he kept a drawer in his desk stocked with snacks and a radio that played news and R&B music.*

*I would visit Uncle Fred every day during my break. He let me know that he was proud of me. He cheered me on. Uncle Fred was more of a father than my own dad was. He listened to my issues and gave me good advice.*

*Uncle Fred was soooooo lucky to be admitted to the hospital where his daughters worked, especially during COVID-19, near the end.*
