However, he was fortunate in that he already had three older sisters and an older brother: Annette, Charlene, Carol and Fred. Garnett and Joyce bore another son Curtis. After the death of Joyce, Garnett married Nellie and to them a son was born, Richard (The Little One). And all together they made a wonderful family.

Harold received Christ as Lord of his life at an early age. Harold graduated from Northwest High School, where earned a Sports Scholarship from Texas Tech in Lubbock, Texas. While attending Tech, he earned the nickname "HFactor". On January 1, 1981, Harold lost his sight due to a medical condition. Although he was never able to achieve his dream of playing professional baseball, Harold was able to play "Beep-Baseball" where his team would earn "World Series".

Harold was a diehard Chicago Cubs Fan. He was also an all-around sports fan loving his hometown teams of the Indianapolis Colts and Pacers. You would always find him watching sports when he was not busy enjoying time with his family. Besides sports, Harold enjoyed music and travel.

Harold was a person of great will and determination. After losing his sight and trying to put his life back together, Harold attended Cross Roads

Rehabilitation Center. He was able to become retrained with a specialty in Computer Programming. Harold's sight was partially restored on June 8, 1988. Afterwards, Harold obtained employment with the Internal Revenue Service in 1988. In 1995, Harold met his future wife, who was also employed by the IRS. Harold was officially retired from the IRS on June 1, 2010.
