Harvey Dion Moorner was born on January 4, 1964 to the late Willie James and Mary Moorner in Detroit, Michigan. He was the fourth of six children. Harvey accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior at an early age. He became a member of Second Ebenezer Church on September 6, 1998 under the leadership of Bishop Edgar L. Vann, II. He faithfully served as a team member on the First Impressions Ministry (Team 1). He was preceded in death by his parents and one brother, Mitchell Moorner.

Harvey graduated from Mumford High School in 1982, a Detroit Public School. Shortly after graduation, he joined the U.S. Marine Corp and became a Corporal and sharp shooter with an honorable discharge in May 1988.
