Celebrating the Life Of Horace Scott:

Horace Scott was born on September 21, 1957, on a beautiful Saturday. He was the seventh child of 12 for Elder John E. Scott and Rosa Lee (Sledge) Scott.

He attended Detroit Public Schools. At Western High School he found a great interest in auto mechanics and machine shop. He was preceded in death by both parents and three sisters (Christine Scott, Gloria Scott and Sandra Foster).

He began his work experience with his Dad in the construction and masonry business. On many Saturdays he would go to work with Dad and learn valuable home building and repair skills. He also worked in the restaurant hospitality industry.

As a teenager he was employed at "Jack In The Box," "Popeyes Chicken" and "Churches Chicken" where he rose through the ranks of crew member to assistant manager.

Horace accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior early in his life. On many Sundays he could be found taking the bus to church with his mother

and siblings. Oftentimes when he was in service, he would sing and pat his feet to the gospel songs and congregation hymns. However, the main treat of the day was when Dad would mount the pulpit and preach the word like nobody else could.

As a young man Horace grew up in "Tomb Stone" as we affectionately called it. These days you call it "Mexican Town" but we claimed it first. St. Anne, 18th and Bagley, Lafayette, Porter and West Vernor was his boundary. On most nights after school you could find him at the "Tap Center" playing basketball, horseshoes, ping pong and pool. His neighborhood partners were the MacDonald's, Loves and Williams families. P-Joe, Boney, Chubby, Rod, Yogi, Yvette, Yolanda, Italee and Mrs. Betty Jean took him into their home like one of their own.
