Mrs. Izetta Brown-Williams was born in Springfield, Illinois on July 2, 1913, to the late George Brown and Della Link Brown. Mrs. Williams met and married Floyd Williams after World War II. She was a “Rosie Riveter” during the war; working in the factory; due to the shortage of men during wartime. Mr. Floyd Williams became a mason, Mrs. Williams joined the daughter of Eastern Star. They had many friends and affiliates. Mrs. Williams was an honorable lady in her community and church world. She had been a member of Liberty Temple for many years. She loved Detroit, Michigan. She once said, “I will never move back to Illinois,” true to her words she did not. Mr. Williams passed in 1993. She remained active in church and community. Mrs. Williams was known also as, Mother Williams, offering wisdom and guidance to young people.

During the 1960s and 1970s, she worked at Dittrich Furs was a seamstress. At that time it was special prestigious work for black women. Mrs. Williams enjoyed going to social events and church affiliated entertainment activities, she enjoyed and volunteered her time, energy, and donations. She will be missed and was much loved. Immediate family, siblings preceded her in death; sisters, Leomia Walker, Lavonda Brown, Martineau Brown; brothers, George Brown, Jr., Wendell Brown, Everett Brown, Otis Lee “Sonny” Brown. Those still living among siblings; Kenneth Brown, Willie Mae Micks; one godson, Donald E. Cole; many foster children; a host of nieces and nephews,

other relatives and friends. Her pet dog, "Foxy" was over twenty-five years old and constant companion of Mrs. Williams.

Mrs. Williams touched many lives with her goodness and kindness. She was recognized by the Charles H. Wright Museum of African American History as a centennial; those Detroit residents over one hundred years old in age; having lived a century or more.
