Jacqueline Hullum, affectionately known as Jackie, was born in Detroit, Michigan on November 27, 1938, to Theodore and Lucille Hullum.

Jackie attended Detroit's Central High School where she was active with the Future Teachers Club. In addition she earned a Bachelor of Arts from the University of Detroit and a Master of Arts from Wayne State University. She taught eleventh and twelfth grade English in the Detroit Public Schools system for 34 years. Jackie loved her teaching job and saw her role as assisting students in recognizing the importance of good writing skills to daily living.

She met and married Edmond Gibson on March 3, 1990. After her marriage to Edmond, she joined Anderson Memorial Church of God in Christ, Bishop Anderson pastor and Shiloh Chapel Church of God in Christ, Bishop Smith pastor. They later joined Sacred Portals Church of God in Christ pastored by Apostle Harold Johnson. She was active with the Mothers' Board, Sewing Circle, Vacation Bible School, and Prayer Warriors. She was also a Missionary and taught at the church often. She remained at Sacred Portals until her passing.

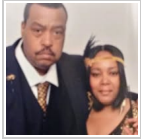
