The Life and Legacy of Jesse Jackson:

Jesse Jackson was born on February 6, 1928 to Eddie Jackson and Mattie Bell Westbrook. To that union was three children, William, Jesse and Geneva. The family of five moved from Birmingham, Alabama to Detroit, Michigan.

Jesse attended Pershing School. After high school, he was drafted into the Army, fought in the Korean War, 25th Infantry Division, and the 24th Infantry Regiment and received a Purple Heart.

In a previous relationship, Jesse had two children, Mario and Violetta. On February 8, 1964 Jesse married Francine and from that union there was three children, Kimberly, Tina and Michael. Jesse worked at Ford Motor Company for 25 years and retired in December of 1990.

After retirement Jesse enjoyed life with his family and friends. Jesse spent more than 30 years as a coach for the Westside Pirates and President of the Westside Steelers. During that time he mentored, was a father, and changed countless young men's lives. He always included the young people in his life and it will always be remembered.
