Naming Isabella Jewel after me was an honor and a very special and unexpected gift. Stay on her, she has your Aunt Gwen's personality which means that she is strong-willed and will talk forever to everyone she passes. Please make sure that Bella and Peanut know all about

me and how much I love them. Remember that sweet potato pies take a lot of sugar and butter. To each of my children. No matter what, you must love each other. Be patient, kind and generous with each other. Keep our traditions alive. Make sure that someone wears my ugly red sweater on Christmas day. Remember that I have loved no one more than I love each of you. To my son Gregory; I am with you always, I have loved you always, I am so very proud of you.

I have lived a wonderful life. I have picked cotton, thrown that sack on my back and taken it to market to sell to help my family survive. I have sold high end-jewelry and worn 3" high heels to work. God has given me all that I have asked of him and for this I am so grateful. My life has been one of much love. Who could ask for more?

Before I close, I have a favor to ask of you. When you have a moment, check on my Gwennie and Robert. Gwen has been not only the one who cared for me all these years, she is my best friend. For almost 40 years we have spent most days together. We planned her wedding together. We prepared for the birth of her son together. She was my companion on hundreds of trips to doctors, clinics for testing and rehabilitation programs. She spent dozens of nights by my hospital bed, sleeping in chairs or on some hospital cot. She made sure that I had everything that I even thought that I wanted. She kept

me alive, against all odds, for a very long time. We laugh a lot. We shop for things we don't need. We go to McDonald's or Burger King and eat that bad food and talk about the way people dress. We talk about things that were funny to us but would make Diane run out of the room calling on Jesus. I love Gwen Willis deeply.

Robert Willis never leaves his home without returning with candy bars or pies or something to help with my out-of-control sweet tooth. He makes breakfast for me every day. He has made me the center of his life and never complains when his wife does the same. He calls me Mom. He loves me and has shown me that every day of my 8 years in their home. I love you Robert.

Miss me but don't cry for me. I am up here running around with my people and having a great time. I'm happy now. I'm healthy now. I'll see you when you get here.
