On September 17, 1933 Johnnie Hardrick was born to Clarence and Daisy Hardrick in Hernando, Mississippi.

In May of 1950, Johnnie graduated from high school in Desoto County, Mississippi and soon after moved to Detroit, Michigan and married the love of his life, Ruby D. Tate, a union that lasted for 52 years until her death in June of 2008. From this union they had four children:

Johnnie believed in sacrificing to provide for and take care of his family. Hard work, acquiring a skilled trade or advanced education were the principles that Johnnie lived by and instilled in his children, family members and others as well. His education included receiving a degree in Retail and Marketing Management from WCCCD in 1972 and continually renewed his licenses at Middleton Real Estate School. The span of his working career included becoming a business owner (Pic, Pac Supermarket), Real Estate Agent, Licensed Journeyman (UFCW) and a Regional District Manager for Borman Bros. Inc (Farmer Jack).
