Going Home Celebration Of Julian Herman Richardson:

Julian Herman Richardson was born August 9, 1923 in Detroit, Michigan to James and Julia Richardson. At six months, his parents relocated to Birmingham, Alabama where he spent the rest of his childhood.

In 1943, he graduated from Parker High School in Birmingham, Alabama and shortly after he enlisted into the United States Army where he served 3 years fighting in World War II. Upon honorable discharge in 1946, his bravery during the war earned him a multitude of recognition including the APTO medal; Philippine Liberation Ribbon with one bronze star, Good Conduct Medal, and the World War II Victory Medal.

He returned to Detroit and worked various jobs including Chrysler, the Tank Arsenal, among others. He was later employed by the City of Detroit Health Department where he moved up to be a building tradesman for 28 years. He never missed a day! His commitment and strong work ethic earned him a Letter of Appreciation for reporting to work during the 1967 Detroit riots. He retired in 1986.

He met Annie Calhoun and they married in 1950. They were married for 17 years and produced two children, Alicia Ann Richardson-Lewis and Calvin Herman Richardson.

In 1994 he left Detroit and moved to Marysville, Michigan, where he was an outstanding citizen and respected by all who knew him. He was a devout Christian, especially in his later years.

He passed away on July 17, 2015, in Marysville after a tragic car accident.
