Katherine Reliford was born on May 3, 1938 in Montrose, Georgia, the third of five children of Fletcher and Jamesy L. Reliford. She moved to Detroit, Michigan with her parents at the age of four.

Katherine accepted Christ at an early age.

She attended Columbia Elementary, Sill Elementary, Condon Junior High and graduated from the High School of Commerce.

She later received a B.S. Degree in special education from Wayne State University.

Katherine worked for the U.S. Postal Service from August 1956 to 1979 where she held a number of positions, including ad hoc women's program coordinator and contract compliance assistant.

She transferred to the U.S. EEOC in July 1979, where she worked until her retirement in September 1, 1998, as a senior investigator of discrimination complaints. She also worked as a substitute teacher with the Detroit Board of Education. Her favorite hobby was writing poetry.
