



Dr. Keethley Eustace Johnson

September 30, 1928 - April 26, 2021

Dr. Keethley “Keithley” Eustace Johnson, only child born to Melville Hanley and Luz Johnson on September 30, 1928 in the parish of St. George, Nevis. He was confirmed in the Catholic Church in Nevis, but as an adult in support of his Christian faith and belief he worshiped at any church in close proximity to his medical practice.

Dr. Johnson completed his high school education at St. Kitts Grammar School where he was a honor student and obtained the Senior Cambridge High School Certificate (England). After high school, he immigrated to the USA to be with relatives and attend Southern University in Louisiana. He was a member of the National Honorary Scientific Society and Omega Psi Phi Fraternity and graduated with a BS degree. He moved to Michigan and attended Michigan State University and by age 26 completed his Master’s and Ph.D. degrees in Science.

Following his academic achievements, Dr. Johnson accepted a research position with the State of Michigan to conduct research in concert with the University of Ibaden, in Western Nigeria, Africa. He had several publications related to this project and other research efforts. After his assignment in Africa was completed, Dr. Johnson returned to Michigan and worked briefly as a research associate with Wayne State University Medical School and the

Veterans Administration Hospital before attending medical school at Wayne State University where he earned a M.D. degree in 1968. He practiced at Annapolis and Oakwood Hospitals until he established his private practice in the cities of Wayne and Oxford, Michigan. He retired in 1993 and continued to do volunteer services at Detroit Medical Center.

He was a world traveler. In addition to traveling to numerous parts of the USA and Canada. Dr. Johnson visited countries in Europe, Asia, Africa, South America, and the Caribbean. He was very adventurous and enjoyed all forms of sports, and even had a pilot's license. He was an avid reader and enjoyed playing dominos and board games, especially chess. He was proud of his cultural heritage and was a founding member of the West Indian American Association of Michigan (WIAA).
