Lindbergh Bobo, Sr., affectionately known as “Bo,” was born on December 29, 1927 in Little Rock, AR to the late Harry and Cherry Bobo. He was the youngest of 4 children. His brothers James Smith and Lucious Bobo preceded him in death. He attended the Phillips School District in Phillips County, AR.

Lindbergh met Loistein Ford (she preceded him in death) and they were united in holy matrimony on June 17, 1951 in Arkansas. This union was blessed with 6 children. The first 3, James, (he preceded him in death), Lindbergh Jr., (he preceded him in death) and Carolyn were born in Arkansas.

Lindbergh left the south and went to Detroit, MI for better employment. After he began working at General Motors, he traveled back to Arkansas to move his family to Detroit, MI on Mother’s Day of 1956, which is where their last 3 children, Oscar, Denver and Clearlis were born.

Lindbergh began working for General Motors on December 15, 1955 as a high-low driver and truck driver. He was employed there for 33 years, retiring in 1988. Lindbergh met Learly Polk (she preceded him in death) and they were united in holy matrimony in 1977.

Lindbergh became a Mason of the Mt. Lebanon Lodge #491 in 1980. He was a faithful member of Silver Star Baptist Church since 1983. He was a skilled hunter and fisherman. He loved to play card games such as Poker, Spades,

Bid Whist and Tonk. He loved listening to the Blues and spending time with his family on the holidays.

His favorite brand of automobile was the Cadillac... specifically the black Brougham. He wouldn't own any other.

Lindbergh was a man of true style and coordination. He adorned a 6 foot solid built frame, with a caramel complexion. He was ALWAYS perfectly groomed whether he was at work, or on his own time. When he wore one of his many suits, he believed in doing it completely with the vest, tie, hat with the feather in the hatband, pocket square and shoes to bring his look together. His mane, facial hair and nails were meticulous. And he always left the aroma of "Aramis" wherever he went. Yes, Mr. Lindbergh Bobo, Sr. was always groomed to perfection just because he could be. More importantly, he protected, provided for and deeply loved his family, which is always in style.
