Ms. Lorena Lois Waters was born to DeSoto and Lorena Waters on January 18, 1929 in Wagner, Oklahoma. She was the 16th child of 18 children of whom 17 children preceded her in death. She started her early education in Claremore, Oklahoma. In the early 1940s she was baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. After moving to Detroit with her family, she furthered her education at Miller High School.

Lorena met and married John Randolph O'Neill; they were married for 37 years. Through this union, they were blessed with four children.

She worked for Chrysler Motor Company for 28 years.

Later in life she received the Holy Ghost under the leadership of her brother, Elder Theophilus Waters, at Greater Church by Christ Jesus where she sung in the choir, served as a Missionary and was head of the Pastor's Aid Committee. After the death of her pastor, she attended Greater Love Tabernacle Church of God in Christ (5 years) under the teaching of Bishop Clifford Caleb Dunlap. Upon his passing, she joined First Baptist World Changers International Ministries (present), Apostle Lennell D. Caldwell.

Mother Waters was very faithful to God and the church. She loved shopping, going to the amusement parks, learning and playing the piano under the direction of Ray Daniels House of Music. She also loved being with her children and grandchildren. Her passion was cooking and baking and feeding her family. She was most famous for 7Up Pound cakes and Sweet Potatoes pies.
