While in Detroit, Louis worked at Ford Motor Company, which then led him to exploring his entrepreneurship desires. This led him to opening a resale shop called Anderson's Resale and a prospering real estate business.

Louis loved his family. He enjoyed cooking for everyone and everyone loved his cooking. EVERYONE. He was known as the "coon man" of the neighborhood and was known as a man that would (and could) eat anything.

He would also pick up boxes of food from Randazzos and opened his home to anyone who came. In his spare time, he loved playing dominoes and poker with family and friends.
