Mamie Olevia McGill Brown was born July 20, 1924, in Seminole, Alabama, to the late Albert and Vashti Davis. She was the second of three siblings.

Mamie Brown accepted the Lord Jesus Christ at an early age. She attended Mt. Carmel Baptist Church as a child. She also attended Cedar Grove Baptist Church as an adult with her husband and children in Prichard, Alabama. She then decided to move her membership to Antioch Baptist Church, in Rochester, New York, where she served faithfully until her health failed.

After being a mother, wife, and homemaker, most of her early life, Mamie Brown relocated to Rochester, NY in 1971. While living in Rochester, New York, she obtained her G.E.D. and accepted employment at Genesee Hospital, which later became Rochester General. She received numerous Certificates of Appreciation and Awards. In 1982, she was nominated Employee of the Year. She remained at the hospital until her retirement. Once retired, she volunteered her time at the Montgomery Senior Center, in Rochester, NY, which she enjoyed very much.

In August 2012, Mamie Brown relocated to Michigan, where she resided at the Imperial Health Center until her death. On March 22, 2013, Mamie Brown, made the transition to her heavenly home.
