Marion Binion, born on May 30, 1938 in Itta Bena, Mississippi. He was the second eldest of five children born to the union of William and Susie Binion who preceded him in death. Marion's parents moved to Detroit, Michigan when he was three years old.

Marion was educated in the Detroit Public School System and graduated from Northeastern High School in 1958.

He entered the United States Air Force during the Vietnam War and served for four years and was Honorably Discharged. In the Air Force Marion's job was an Electrician. Upon his discharge from the Air Force, Marion later was employed by The Ford Motor Company. Being disenchanted working on the line, Marion took college courses to become a skilled trades man. He retired after 36 1/2 years as a Tool and Die Maker at Ford.

Marion accepted Jesus Christ as His Lord and Savior in 1979 and was baptized by Founding Pastor George W. Bogle of Evangel Ministries.

Pastor Bogle married Marion and Michele Binion and to this union they raised four outstanding children.

Marion and Michele were avid sportsman who enjoyed fishing the Great Lakes and Canadian waters and Maumee, Ohio. Marion and Michele shared the sport of bow hunting White Tail Deer in Michigan and Pike County Trophy Outfitters in Perry, Illinois. Our guides were Bob Cox and Phil Johnson, which became long time friends. We ate what we harvested whether by water or land and blessed others with food.

He spent time with our boys in Remote Control Car Racing every weekend for years.
