Auntie Sister was one individual that I can truly say did not have a mean bone in her body. She was able to show her strength without ever getting her feathers ruffled. She could use her eyes like no one else. She could site an entire paragraph worth of words with her eyes. For example:

When I was approximately 10 years old, I asked to spend the night over their house so that I could hang out with Ronald. One morning, she cooked a breakfast with grits, scrambled eggs and bacon or sausage. The two things I remember for sure are the grits and scrambled eggs. I always ate with silverware at home, but for some reason, I decided to eat the eggs and grits with my fingers. She looked at me for a split second and what she said with her eyes was, " What in the world is going on at my brother's house? This child is eating live a savage. Are they not spending time with him? By the age of 10 he should be eating with siverware. Why would they allow him to eat like this?" With her mouth she just simply said, "Why don't you try eating that with your fork". And when I did just that, she gave me some encouragement that I was doing a good job. I felt like I had ruined my parent's reputation. I felt so stupid and was so embarrassed that this is the first time I have mentioned this 30 plus year old incident.

Although I am deeply saddened at this moment, I am happy about one thing: She was saved at an early age and acknowledged that Jesus Christ is her Lord and Saviour. Therefore, she has just moved on. Like Auntie Sister, all of us will "move on" because spirits do not die. Let's make sure we make the right choice so that we all can
