### Pearl Primus' Life:

Ms. Pearl Primus was born to the late John Wesley Glenn and Mary Jessie Glenn on June 9, 1930 in Laurens, South Carolina. Pearl was the youngest of five children. Three siblings preceded her in death, her twin brother; Johnny Glenn, brother James Glenn, and her sister Mae Rice.

Pearl received her formal education in Laurens, South Carolina. Later, she moved to Detroit, Michigan where she met the love of her life. In 1951, Pearl Glenn was united in holy matrimony to Mose Primus Sr. To this union six children were born; three sons and three daughters of which two sons preceded her in death; Phillip Kurtis Primus and James Willie Primus.
