Quincola was born November 28, 1942 in Enid, Mississippi to Ethel Mae Johnson and Tommy Smith. She was the second child to Ethel (Ventris Ford being the eldest). Jesse Hayes married Ethel and took in both children as his own. Jesse and Ethel had four children together, Katherine Henderson (Hayes), Leon Hayes, Dewayne Hayes (Ricky), and Jesse Hayes, Jr. (Peter). Quincola was preceded in death by both parents, Ethel and Jesse Hayes. Quincola's first school of attendance was a small school in Enid, Mississippi where she learned early on the value of reading. Jesse Hayes moved his wife and six children to St. Louis, MO where Quincola attended Cote Brillante Elementary School. From St. Louis, the Hayes Family moved to Detroit, Michigan (1101 Patricia) where Quincola attended Southwestern High School. After graduating high school, Quincola worked as a seamstress while paying her college tuition to attend Wayne State University. Quincola graduated June 17, 1969 with a Bachelor of Science in Education degree from Wayne State University and was awarded a Teaching Certificate from the State of Michigan June 11, 1974. Quincola started her teaching career as a substitute teacher at Cass Technical High School. Her first full-time teaching assignment was at Hutchins Middle School. From Hutchins, Quincola taught Economics and History at Northern High School. In 1980, Quincola was recruited to teach at Renaissance High School where she taught U.S. History until she retired in

2003. Quincola was respected by her peers and loved by her students. She taught individuals to think outside the box, document everything and perform with excellence in everything they do.

Quincola married Donald Wyatt in August of 1975, and they were married until her death, May 25, 2020. They cherished their lives together and had two children, Ernest Baron Wyatt and Deana Marcia Wyatt...
