Ronald William Ford Sr. was born on July 3, 1940 to Lucille Lillian Ford and James Clinton Ford Sr. Born in Detroit, Michigan – lived in Brewster Projects until 12 years old with his brother and mother, then they moved to a better neighborhood in Detroit.

He went to Cass Technical High School then later went to Northwestern High School and later went to United States Army at 17 years old. The first tour which he served was in Korea and Fort Sill, Oklahoma; his second tour was served in Hawaii and Fort Knox, in the Infantry and on the boxing team. Within this time, he married Delores Pearson and from that union came Ronald William Ford Jr. and Robert Darren Ford.

He was a loving husband and father, great provider to his family. He worked jobs at Ford Motor and Chrysler Motor companies. Later he worked for Michigan Bell which is now AT&T, where he retired from as a Service Technician. He was a very methodical man.

His love, hobby and passion was automobiles. He was a mechanic who bought and sold cars. In his retirement he was an entrepreneur in this as well in transportation. He had his own tow company. In his later years, he got his C.D.L. license and worked for trucking, limo and bus transportation

companies.

On Wednesday, July 19, 2017, at 5:00 A.M. at Harper Hospital, Ronald William Ford Sr. departed, by the hand of God, from this life.
