Celebrating The Life Of Ruth Brown:

Ruth Brown was born Sylvia Ruth Robinson in Chidster, Arkansas to Mose and Mamie Robinson on March 29, 1923. She was the fourth of five children. All of her siblings preceded her in death.

In the third grade Ruth made the decision to drop the Sylvia from her name after being called Sylva Rooster.

She was educated in the Arkansas Schools and began her college education at Tennessee State University. She finished her education graduating from the University of Michigan-Dearborn after raising her children.

In 1948, she married William Brown, who preceded her in death. To this nearly 60 year union, three children, Linda Diane, Jennifer Ellyn and Gerald Allan were born. Her granddaughter, Nicole Alexandria whom she called "Punchkin," was the light of her life.

Throughout her life, Ruth had various jobs. She retired from the Detroit Board of Education as an assistant attendance officer in 1991.

After retiring, she traveled extensively with her husband to visit family, friends and faraway places.

Ruth was a faithful member of Hope Presbyterian Church for more than 40 years. She served as a Deacon, Elder and Moderator of her beloved Presbyterian Women. After her health declined and she could not attend services, she always wanted to know what was going on at Hope.
