Samuel Lee DeLaughter, Jr. was born on June 2, 1940 to Samuel Lee and Jessie Lee DeLaughter. To this union there were two more sons, Albert Grant DeLaughter and Kenneth DeLaughter. Samuel's parents and brother Albert preceded him in death.

Samuel professed Christ at Chapel Hill Missionary Baptist Church at an early age, the Pastor was Roy A. Allen. Samuel enjoyed singing in the choir and was known for his high tenor rendition of the Lord's Prayer. He later joined the United Presbyterian Church of the Master, on December 21, 1975, under the late Pastor Richard Reynolds.

He was educated in the Detroit Public School system. Samuel served in the United States Army Reserves. He later married his high school sweetheart, Winnie Gladys Green, on January 20, 1959. To this union was born: Pamela, Denise, Wanda, David, Darryl and Gerald. They were married slightly over 30 years.

After returning home from the Army, he worked for C.W. Morris Funeral Home, was employed by The Chrysler Corporation and later worked security for several companies.

Samuel enjoyed the position of assistant coach (Winnie DeLaughter was the coach) of the church female softball team, which Pamela, Denise and Wanda were members.

He enjoyed bowling, fishing, singing, traveling and dancing. Samuel, like his father enjoyed listening to the Detroit Tigers on the radio and watching them on television. Samuel and his father also enjoyed attending gospel concerts in the city.

Samuel later in life resided with his daughter, Denise Lynne Weathersby who continued as his primary caregiver until his passing.
