While in Detroit, Sandy attended the Detroit Public Schools. She attended Moore Elementary, Sherod Jr. High and graduated from Cass Technical High School.

Sandra met Gary A. Lawler after graduating from high school, the two later married on March 12, 1960. To this union two children were born.

After marriage Sandy continued her education and went on to obtain her nursing degree, she became a LPN and started her journey working at Detroit Receiving Hospital. Sandy didn't stop there, she began working for the City of Detroit (Bruce Douglas and Toledo Hubbard) where she was dedicated and hard working at her job. She loved what she did. Sandra retired from the City of Detroit after 30 plus years of service.

After retiring, Sandra couldn't sit still no matter how much her family begged her to take it easy, so she tiptoed her way back into nursing by doing private

home care cases for Kelly Services. She continued that for several years until her health began to fail.

Sandra accepted Christ as her Lord and Savior at an early age. She attended many churches but became a loyal member of Silver Star Missionary Baptist Church in the fall of 1982 under the leadership of the late Pastor V. J. Vasser.

After the passing of Pastor Vasser, Sandra continued her membership at S.S.M.B.C. under the new leadership of Pastor Leroy Hurst Jr. While being a member of Silver Star, Sandra served on the Usher Board and later joined the Mothers Board where she was active until she was no longer able to attend church.
