Shack Kincaid was born on July 30, 1928 in Ludlow, Mississippi to Willie and Geneva (Young) Kincaid. He was the youngest of ten children born to that union.

Shack enjoyed church-worship with his parents and siblings. He accepted Christ and was Baptized at an early age. His love for the Lord was evident throughout his life.

While attending school, Shack worked hard with his father and siblings - farming, field work or whatever was needed. He started to develop self-taught skills that would help prepare him for the future.

Shack met and married his “sweetheart,” Dora Lee Harvey of Pelahatchie, Mississippi. He was determined to find work with better pay so he and wife, Dora could have a better life. His older brothers -Leonard “Doogie” and Eugene “Bud” had already moved up north to find work. He maintained a strong work ethic, very rarely taking any time off for which he often received recognition for job performance and attendance.

His wife Dora soon joined him, and they eventually moved into their first home on Humboldt St. and became members of Messiah Baptist Church also on Humboldt, Rev. TC Simmons was Pastor. He was also a member of the

Acapella Chorus.

Shack served in the U.S. Armed Forces, Korean War receiving recognition for combat duty and an honorable discharge. After he returned home from the war, Shack and Dora started their family of which four children were born to this union: Regina, Shack Jr., Linda Faye and Alex. He enjoyed doing things with his family; attending church, visiting relatives, vacations “down home” in Mississippi (where he could “hunt” and “fish”), barbecuing and making homemade ice cream!

The Lord called Dora to her “heavenly home” on April 15, 1975. Shack and Dora were married for over 25 years.

Shack was most proud of his family and always remained present in their lives. Always willing to help, give advice and share wisdom with “love,” which he extended to others.

Shack retired after 36 years of employment with Cadillac. There would be more time to spend with his family and work on his many projects amongst other things.
