Vera Anima Okai was born on June 5, 1959 in Boso, Eastern Region of Ghana to Mr. Albert Okai and Janet Sika, all of blessed memories.

Vera was born into a family of Presbyterians and so she accepted Christ at an early age.

Vera attended the Presbyterian Primary School at Boso and continued to the Akosombo Middle School and obtained her Basic School diploma in 1976. She continued her education at the Calvary Methodist Vocational School in 1980 where she mastered sewing and became a seamstress in 1980.

Vera practiced sewing and worked as a teacher's assistant at a nursery school in Ghana. She also worked as a store clerk at a pharmacy prior to coming to the United States. In the United States, she worked for the Henry Ford Village as a Certified Nurse Assistant from August 27, 2012 until her passing.

She was joined in holy matrimony with Stephen Addo for twelve years and there were no children to this union.

Vera departed this life on December 14, 2016.
