Walter began working for Peregrine and later for General Motors Poletown and Lake Orion automotive divisions. He has received many certifications and awards during his lifetime. In his spare time, Walter loved playing pool and playing the drums and guitar or just singing and having fun with his brother James Green and friends or discussing daily issues or arguing with his brother in- law Frank. Littleman also loved bowling and barbecuing, fishing and going to church with his son and daughter and nieces and nephews.

On March 29, 2013, Walter was admitted to Henry Ford Hospital for what he thought was a cold but was diagnosed to be stage 4 cancer. 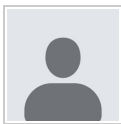

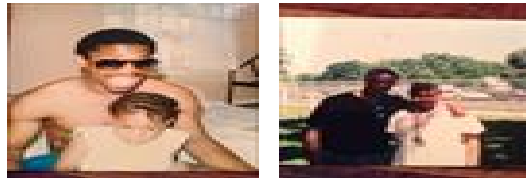
